

LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Dear Christ the King Families,

Welcome back and our wish to you is a very Happy 2012! The students and teachers seem to be very excited to return to school after the two week break.

School families have recently received an **Application Form**. **Please disregard this form**. In the Friday Folder this week you will receive a **Registration Form** for the 2012—2013 school year. Please fill out this form and return to the school office by **January 12, 2012**. If you have already filled out the **Application Form** you do not need to send in the **Registration Form**.

Families currently enrolled in CTK School have the highest priority for enrollment. Within the next 2 weeks we will be gathering those **Registration Forms, received by January 12, 2012**, before officially acting on new applications for enrollment. We also send applications to our parish families who have school aged children not enrolled at CTK. A few new families have contacted us already about touring the school and possibly applying to enroll next school year. We anticipate a waiting list in a few grade levels. Please help us by inviting your friends and families to contact our school office (812)476-1792 to learn more about becoming a part of Christ the King School. We began this school year with 188 students and look forward to over 200 students next school year!

As you begin to prepare to file your 2011 taxes be sure to research the Private School Tax Deduction. I have attached the Scheduler 2 Tax Deduction Form and an information page for you to reference as well. Be sure to read all of this information for a possible tax savings.

***“Private School/Home School Tax Deduction:** The bill establishes an Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Tax deduction for individual taxpayers who make unreimbursed expenditures for enrollment of a dependent child in a private school or to home school a dependent child. The deduction is equal to \$1,000 per dependent child for whom such unreimbursed education expenditures are made. The deduction is effective beginning in tax year 2011.”*

It's that time of year again when the weather becomes very unpredictable and cold. Students will be kept indoors if conditions are too cold, too windy, or precipitating. Be sure to send your children to school prepared to go outdoors—gloves, scarf, hat or hood. This is especially important for those students on safety patrol before and after school.

We will continue to follow the decisions of the Evansville Vanderburgh County School Corporation with regard to school closings and delays. You can get this information on the local television and radio stations. We will also send a School Reach Message to your phone as well.
